

Ghassan R. Ghorayeb, MD

Dr. Ghorayeb earned his medical degree with distinction at Boston University School of Medicine in 2006. He was named Intern of the Year at Cambridge Hospital, a Harvard affiliated institution, in 2007. Dr. Ghorayeb completed his vitreoretinal surgical fellowship at the University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston TX where he served as Chief Resident and won the Award for Exceptional Achievement. He was also a fellow and clinical instructor at M.D. Anderson Cancer Center.

He joined The West Virginia University Eye Institute (WVUEI) in 2012 where he continues to practice as an Assistant Professor of Ophthalmology. He led the medical student curriculum in Ophthalmology there from 2012 to 2016. Later that year he was promoted to director of the vitreoretinal fellowship. He is currently a primary investigator on multiple national clinical trials relating to macular degeneration, diabetes, retinopathy of prematurity and other retinal vascular diseases. In 2016, he founded the ocular oncology division at WVUEI and continues to lead that endeavor as director of that section.

He is a board-certified ophthalmologist, a member of the American Medical Academy and the Academy of Ophthalmology. He serves as a mentor for junior trainees and as a training committee member at the American Society of Retina Specialists.
