

Mrinali Gupta, MD is a vitreoretinal surgeon and Assistant Professor of Ophthalmology at Weill Cornell Medical College.

Dr. Gupta graduated *summa cum laude* and Phi Beta Kappa from Duke University. She received her M.D. from Duke University School of Medicine, where she was the recipient of the E. Arthur Palumbo Duke University School of Medicine Scholarship and was elected to the Alpha Omega Alpha academic honor society. She was also the class of 2009 recipient of the Duke Med Thomas Jefferson Award for excellence in academics, research, and service. Dr. Gupta spent one year conducting age-related macular degeneration research at the National Eye Institute of the National Institutes of Health as a Howard Hughes Medical Institute / National Institutes of Health Scholar.

Dr. Gupta completed residency training at Harvard Medical School / Mass Eye and Ear Infirmary, followed by vitreoretinal surgery fellowship training at Weill Cornell Medical College. During her fellowship, Dr. Gupta was the recipient of the Heed Ophthalmic Foundation Fellowship and the Ronald G. Michels Fellowship Foundation Award.

Dr. Gupta is actively engaged in clinical, translational, and basic science research in retinal diseases. She has published over 50 peer-reviewed research articles and several book chapters. Dr. Gupta is committed to resident and fellow education and serves as Program Director for the Weill Cornell Medical College Medical Retina Fellowship. She also serves on the Executive Committee and Education Committees of the Vit-Buckle Society and on the Education and Training Committee of the American Society of Retina Specialists.
